


Warmest thanks to everybody who attended."




It's been a reflective time for Peterborough's Poverty Truth Commission as we start approaching the end of our two-year commission cycle. January 2023, when we started, feels like such a long time ago now, and even our launch last November (see the video here!) is starting to get a bit misty.

We weren't really sure what was going to happen when Cheryl and I convened everybody for our first full commission meeting in February, but we knew we had a great group of people and a lot of goodwill and faith that we could start doing things different in Peterborough. We quickly developed a rapport and a shared understanding within the group which only continued to deepen as we kept meeting as a full commission and then started getting together in smaller, more focused groups.

Even apart from the friendships and connections we've made, there's a lot we've achieved, and plenty of ways our impact will go on beyond this commission cycle. We've worked extensively with Peterborough City Council to see what can be improved about their Housing Jigsaw portal, and more generally with their processes around registering as homeless and applying for accommodation. We've identified that form filling, particularly digital forms, is a huge barrier for people trying to access services, and we've worked with Jobsmart to run a pilot offering face-to-face help with forms (**see below for info!**)

We've also partnered with Connecting Cambridgeshire to assist in convening a digital inclusion forum in the city and to help identify spaces and communities that would benefit from the resources Connecting Cambridgeshire can offer, such as assisting with Wi-Fi connections, purchasing devices for use in the space or to be loaned out, and help with training digital champions. Over the last couple of months, we've also been working with Kip and Julian, the same filmmakers who produced the excellent films we showed at our launch event and produced the highlights video for our launch that we linked above. We're excited to show you what we've been working on! We're planning to show this last film at our celebration event, which is going to be on the 26th of February next year, at Kingsgate in Parnwell.
