PCVS launches New Website for 2025!







Grants Programme - Round Two

Promoting health and well-being and opportunity for all, by tackling health inequalities in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough

The Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Assura/ICB grant programme is now open for applications.

Voluntary sector organisations can apply for up to £12,000 to fund projects that work with local people to tackle health inequalities and promote wellbeing at an Integrated Neighbourhood level. The grant programme criteria sets out a list of the areas that are being targeted in this round.

CVS Recovery Project

The National Lottery funded CVS Recovery Project has just completed its third year. We are pleased to be able to continue our work on forums and Poverty Truth Commission until the end of March next year.

The forums have continued to been busy with many issues.....

The Disability forum is still very engaged with the Station Quarter redevelopment. Members see this as a once in a generation opportunity to make Peterborough more accessible. Discussion on the Assisted Dying bill is also high on the agenda for the new year.

The Domestic Abuse forum are planning an International Women's Day event, to try to engage local students in discussion of issues around sexual harassment. Recently members have been busy with the 16 days of action against gender violence, including the flag raising and Mayor's reception noted in last month's newsletter.

We were also extremely pleased to be able to redistribute a number of refurbished mobile phones to enable survivors of domestic abuse to reach out for help more safely.

The Food Poverty Forum: We have run a series of workshops with community hubs on identifying all the work carried out in the hubs, awareness raising of diversifying income and how to implement that. As a result of that work PCVS has been successful in gaining some funding from NAVCA and Cadent to begin to develop more Centres for Warmth in Peterborough. We also say a big thank you to our partners at Allia Impact, for their support in funding the training workshops.

The Health and Wellbeing Forum: Presentations have included the new employment support project: 'Workwell' which will be delivered by Papworth Trust (see the flyer shown at the end of this newsletter for more information). We have also hosted a really thought provoking training session on Self-Harm Awareness delivered by YMCA on behalf of Fullscope and the team of young people who created a great film resource for this purpose.

In these final few months of the project we will be carrying out research focusing on:

Community Cohesion - Last summer the UK experienced huge tensions, fueled by far-right rhetoric - for a while Peterborough experienced a palpable fear of rioting and racial hatred. The riots didn't happen, but people did turn out to support our communities. We want our research to explore how we can all work together to strengthen understanding and share community life across the city. This is our place - Peterborough - and we feel strongly that it is the people of the city who should be setting the agenda not outsiders.


Digital Inclusion/Exclusion - We have been pleased to support 'Connecting Cambridgeshire' as they begin to work in Peterborough, and will be using research to map current provision in the city both at an institutional level and at a community level. Once the initial mapping has been completed, we will work with Connecting Cambridgeshire to develop a digital forum, who will help decide what, and where initiatives like digital hubs or volunteer recruitment for digital champions might be best placed. We know there is a huge amount of digital inclusion work that happens under the radar in the city by communities.



Cadent Centres for Warmth

We are extremely pleased to announce our newest project funded by a partnership between Cadent and NAVCA. This project idea came directly from the work of the Food Poverty Forum and demonstrates the strength of local collaborative working.

Working together to tackle poverty in Peterborough

Peterborough City Council is launching a project to address poverty and disadvantage, aiming to develop a comprehensive strategy informed by local data and evidence. The goal of this work is to revolutionise the approach to addressing poverty and disadvantage in the city by developing a single strategy that increases the impact of existing work and creates resilient communities. They are keen to collaborate with partners across the system, including voluntary, community and faith-based organisations.

The work intends to build on the work that has been done within the Poverty Truth Commission. Key areas of interest include:

- Health Inequalities: Poverty is closely linked to health inequalities, leading to chronic conditions, mental health challenges, and barriers to healthcare access. The project seeks evidence on how poverty impacts health outcomes, case studies, and evaluations of programs addressing these issues.
- Child and Family Poverty: Child poverty is a major concern in Peterborough, affecting over a third of children, with a notable negative impact on the education and development of children affected by poverty. The project seeks evidence on the effects of poverty on children and successful interventions for supporting lowincome families.
- Cost of Living Crisis: The rising costs of essentials are pushing more households into poverty, leading to issues like fuel poverty, furniture poverty, and food insecurity. The project seeks evidence on current trends and initiatives - particularly successful approaches for addressing these impacts.

The Chancellor has now replied to our open letter following the October budget, which called for urgent action on the planned increase to employer National Insurance Contributions (NICs) for the voluntary sector.

PCVS represented it's members and joined with many other voluntary sector organizations and our national partner NCVO to ask the Chancellor to consider the negative impact of NI rises on charities and ask for support to protect our vital work. Unfortunately the response was not what we had hoped for and we are disappointed that there will be no exemptions for the sector. We know that this will result in further difficulties for voluntary organisations who are already struggling to provide services in challenging financial circumstances.
