Connecting Peterborough: Digital Inclusion Project

We want to support you to gain some digital skills to help you access the thing you need

The PCVS led Digital Inclusion Project has received a great deal of interest from those communities where access to basic digital support, basic skills and training is remote. Organisations have been approached based on evidence of digital need which has taken into consideration geographic location and population. We are delighted to say that there are now 10 digital hubs in place across the city who are gearing up to run activities ranging from offering a Digital Cafe, basic digital skills training and face to face support for form filling.

Each hub has taken into consideration their respective population needs and based their offer on making a difference for those who are digitally excluded. This is also an opportunity for volunteers to be involved. We are looking for Digital Champions who could support their communities to acquire those skills that make life just a little more easy. So if you have some digital skills to share, we would like to hear from you.

In parallel to this, our Digital Network is growing, and we now have over 50 organisations who have an interest in expanding their own knowledge of the increasingly developing digital world. We are sending out regular information to the Network of what is available in terms of training & topic based webinars which can be easily accessed. We will also be sending out details of 4 training sessions we will be co-ordinating based on subjects decided by the Network.

Peterborough Poverty Truth Commission

On the 19th of June, Peterborough's Poverty Truth Commission had the privilege of being invited to speak at the 2025 edition of the ISLAH Community and Social Research in Peterborough conference, hosted by University Centre Peterborough.

You may remember that we also presented at their last conference in 2023, just as our PTC was picking up steam. Getting to go back there and talk about what we learned was a nice full-circle moment.

We carved our presentation out of a larger piece of work we're doing to embed the learning of our PTC in Peterborough. It was called "Will They *Really* Listen?", as a response to one of the main concerns of our commissioners, and we talked about some of the smaller things we learned (like not assuming everybody can scan a QR code!), along with bigger picture results like the connections we've made between people, and our involvement with Peterborough City Council's Poverty Strategy.

Many thanks to Sameena and everyone else at ISLAH, as well as Claire Bowes and everyone else at University Centre Peterborough for hosting such a wonderful day. There's nothing else quite like it in Peterborough.

The programme is open to all schools, registered charities and not-for-profit organisations, with priority given to projects that provide food and support to young people.

Examples of eligible applications with a focus on food security, children and young people could be:

- A school providing pupils with food for breakfast clubs or snacks throughout the day.
- A school wanting to buy equipment for outdoor or indoor activities.
- A school wanting to develop a food growing area.
- A school supporting an after school club.
- A voluntary organisation working with families to run a food bank.
- An organisation addressing holiday hunger.
- A healthy eating project that supports families to cook healthy meals on a budget.
- A Brownie or Scout group needing funding for new play equipment or activities.

Grants are up to £1,500. There is a rolling deadline but we are currently accumulating applications for Oct-Dec 2025 vote in store.

Here at PCVS we know how hard our local voluntary and community organisations work to make a difference for those living in Peterborough and Cambridgeshire and we want to make sure that this is well recognised and properly valued.

The Third Sector Trends Survey helps to do just that, and we would encourage you to take part and help raise the profile of the VCFSE and highlight the achievements, challenges and ongoing amazing work across the sector.

Many of you will have helped with this research before and if you're a new organisation, Durham University are just as keen to see what you do, how things are going and what you're achieving.

Whether you're big or small - thriving, struggling or just going along as normal – they need to hear from you. It's quick and easy to do on your PC, laptop, tablet or phone. It's interesting too and really helps to build a picture about how the voluntary sector responds to and initiates change in society.

So if you're an amateur sports, dance or gardening club, a village hall, a carers' group, an arts organisation, a campaigning trust; or if you deliver social or health services, care for the environment or run a hostel or food bank – whatever you do, it's all equally important.

The study is big (6,000+ responses in 2022) and runs right across England and Wales. But its focus is still very local – looking at how the voluntary sector develops and works in areas like ours – whether the interests you serve are focused in a neighbourhood/village – or span national/international boundaries. It's completely confidential, incredibly relevant to the voluntary sector and those who support it and only happens every three years.

Changes to Microsoft's offers that may affect small charities

Microsoft is ending its free software offers, like Microsoft 365 Business Premium and Office 365 E1, for charities starting in July. They will instead provide discounts of up to 75% on these services and offer up to 300 free licenses of Microsoft 365 Business Basic. This change has raised concerns among UK charities, particularly smaller ones, due to the potential for increased costs and the short notice provided. Microsoft states the changes are to "streamline and simplify" their offerings, while charities fear a negative impact on their services. An online petition has been launched urging Microsoft to reconsider.

NHS Community Participation Group Volunteer Role

We are working with NHS Cambridgeshire & Peterborough (also known as the Integrated Care Board or ICB) to recruit local people to join a new NHS Community Participation Group.

We are recruiting 8-10 local people to share lived experiences and local voices. Your insight will help to influence priority areas for your local NHS to focus on. You'll help review NHS service proposals, offer insight into how changes might affect different people and communities, and advise on how the NHS can better involve and engage local people in meaningful, inclusive ways.

If you live in Cambridgeshire, Peterborough or Royston, this opportunity is for you! We welcome hearing from people with diverse backgrounds including young people, carers, disabled people and ethnic minorities.

- You will attend the NHS Community Participation Group (six meetings a year), contribute your views and connect with your local community.
- As a guide, you can expect to spend approximately two hours for each formal meeting, plus additional time for preparation and debriefing.

Statement on Proposed Closure of Healthwatch

On Saturday 28th June 2025, it was reported that the forthcoming Penny Dash Review will recommend the closure of Healthwatch and other independent NHS organisations. According to the report, funding for patient and public engagement would instead be redirected in-house: to Local Authorities for adult social care, and to Integrated Care Boards (ICBs) for health services. The stated aim is to bring the patient and public voice closer to service delivery, by embedding engagement directly within these organisations.

We are deeply concerned by these proposals, not only because of the dedicated staff and volunteers who work tirelessly to ensure that people's voices are heard at every level of the health and care system, but also because of the implications for patients and service users.

"Independence is essential to truly effective public engagement. Without it, there is a real risk that the public will lose a trusted, impartial advocate that can hold services to account and speak up without fear or favour."

The Board and Senior Leadership Team will be meeting over the coming weeks to consider how we respond together – and how we can make a strong, collective case for the value of Healthwatch, especially while there is still time for decisions to be influenced or reversed.

We are united in our belief in the vital role Healthwatch plays, and in the values we all share - independence, integrity, and a deep belief in the power of people's voices to drive positive change.

We will continue to keep you updated as soon as we have more clarity on the way forward. Thank you for your continued patience

Have your say on the future of library services in Peterborough

A new Library Needs Assessment survey is now open, and Peterborough City Council is inviting all residents to share their views on the future of library services

across the city.

Run by an independent team, the survey explores:

- How people currently use Peterborough's 10 libraries and mobile library
- What services and facilities matter most to residents

Survey deadline: Monday 5 August at 5pm Paper copies are available at all library locations. Library opening times and addresses can be found on the <u>library website</u>.

This consultation follows feedback received during the 2025/26 budget discussions, where a proposal to reduce the number of libraries was paused. The council has committed to a full needs assessment and is working closely with staff, volunteers, and Friends' groups to ensure everyone has a voice.

Survey results will be analysed and shared by the end of the year.
