PCVS Membership - Important Update

During 2025 PCVS undertook engagement meetings with member organisations to explore our new membership offer. We held a number of events at different times of the day and in different formats to reach as many members as possible and get feedback and suggestions.



The new membership offer was agreed at our AGM in November including a sliding scale of charges. Between November 2025 and March 31st 2026 we encouraged all our members to sign up online and try out the new offer completely free. All our membership is now through the online registration and due to data and privacy issues we cannot transfer memberships from our old database to the new one.

The free trial period expired and from 1st April membership charges apply and some members need to sign up and pay for their annual membership. It is still free for very small organisations (those with turnover of £10k and less) and for any organisation in its first 12 months of existence and support.

The charges agreed at the AGM are :

Organisation Size	Organisation Annual Income	Membership Annual Fees
New	New organisation – Year 1	£0
Micro	£10k and below	£0
Small	£10-50k	£45
Med	£50-250k	£90
Large	£250-999k	£120
Big	£1 million and above	£180

We think you'll agree that this is great value and also allow larger organisations to support our work helping the smaller organisations to thrive.

When you sign up online as a member there are two stages – the first one gives you an online account and establishes any membership fee. But it is really important to then log in with your password and complete your profile questions. These have two functions – the first is to apply for your membership and those questions replicate our olde membership form that many of you will have used previously. The second is that it provides the information to make your own page in the members' directory! This is your showcase to the public and other members hosted on pcvs.co.uk. If you do not have a website already you can use this webpage as a microsite – it is searchable on google etc. If you do have a website then you can link this page to your website.

The members profile is set by default to be private (for safety reasons) and you need to opt in to show your profile in the members' directory through the profile questions. We hope and expect most members to be publicly shown on the directory.

Please be aware that you should use only one email account to register as a member. If others within your organisation require access to the members areas (funding, training, posting your own events etc) you should share with them the log in details.

If you are a micro-organisation and have received an email saying your membership has expired it is highly likely it is because your profile hasn't been completed and so we do not have the required information for your membership. Please follow links in the email to complete the profile information and get your free membership!

Digital Hubs

The roll out of the hubs as part of the Digital Inclusion project has been a huge success with 7 hubs fully up and running and more coming on line over the coming weeks.

It's been a great example of partnership working between PCVS, Connecting Cambridgeshire, Cambridge Online and community groups across the city.

A fortnight ago our Digital lead Cheryl McGuire was at the launch event at Family Action, Woodfield Community Centre, Welland.

The Digital Hub will now run as a regular weekly drop-in every Thursday from 11am to 1pm. Residents can come along for support with using laptops, writing or updating CVs, accessing NHS and other essential services online, online shopping and everyday digital tasks.

Digital Hub Grant Scheme

Following on from the successful roll out of Digital Hubs over the last 12 months, it's great news that the scheme is being expanded, with the second round of Connecting Cambridgeshire's Digital Hub Grant scheme is now open for applications!

As with the first round, grants will be distributed equitably across the county, as follows:

- Four hubs in Peterborough
- Two hubs in each Cambridgeshire district
- One additional grant, allocated subject to demand and application quality

The Digital Hub Grants are valued up to 4.2k, to support community organisations create or strengthen local spaces where residents can access devices, connectivity and digital support. 
Health Research

You will have heard a lot from PCVS over the last few months about our work with research champions and promoting health research in communities more generally, so we thought we'd take some time to highlight some specific studies that are currently part of the NIHR portfolio. Please do take a look! You might not be eligible to take part yourself, but you might know people or communities who are, and we all benefit from increased participation in research, so make sure to share.

D-CYPHYR is a study for young people aged 0-15 that is incredibly easy to take part in: all you have to do is spit in a tube! By studying thousands of DNA samples together with health information, scientists can begin to see the big picture of how our genetics and our environment influence our health. 
PWA are looking for volunteers to help at their Peterborough Women Groups on Tuesday and Thursday 10am - 12pm.

The UK YOUTH Fund

UK Youth and Pears Foundation have launched a new £10 million fund to champion an approach that works: providing multi-year, unrestricted funding alongside targeted capacity-building support to small youth organisations.

The aim of the Fund is to strengthen the financial resilience and capacity of small youth and outdoor learning organisations across the UK.

We aim to achieve this through two key outcomes:

Outcome 1: Improved Financial Sustainability, supporting grantees to invest time and resource in strategic, organisational development through our multi-year unrestricted funding grant programme

Outcome 2: Increased Capability and Organisational Resilience through our capacity building programme

Organisations can apply for multi-year unrestricted funding of up to 10% of annual turnover. This approach ensures that funding is proportional to the size and capacity of your organisation to help ensure sustainability and resilience.

Pride in Place - Recruitment of Board Members

The Government has pledged £40m to Peterborough for:

- Paston, Gunthorpe and Welland
- Orton Malborne and Orton Goldhay

The funding, which will be split equally between the two areas, will support the delivery of investment and improvement in community services, such as regeneration, education, health and employment. It gives communities control of £2m every year for the next 10 years, to be spent on projects that will make a real difference to the areas they live. A key part of the programme is that it is locally led, by those who know their communities best.

People can apply to be board members by sending up to 500 words by email to prideinplace@peterborough.gov.uk before Friday 22 May. Applicants should tell us about themselves, why they want to be a board member, highlight their community passions and examples of how they have supported others or contributed locally.

Board members will be recruited on a rolling basis. A small panel made up of the Board Chair, MP, a representative from the authority and an independent community representative will review applications.

Co-produced with experts by experience, health partners, and unpaid carers of all ages across Cambridgeshire, it reflects a shared commitment to improving unpaid carers' lives.

Why it matters

Since the strategy was launched, both national and local feedback has highlighted that unpaid carers are experiencing increasing pressures. In response it is vital that we refresh the strategy to ensure it remains relevant, effective, and responsive to the challenges unpaid carers face today. The refreshed strategy will run up to 2028.

How you can help

We want to hear from unpaid carers, local organisations, community groups and health and social care professionals. Your insight is vital in helping us to:

- celebrate what is working
- identify where improvements can be made
- shape a refreshed strategy that truly meets current and future needs

The refreshed strategy will be launched in November 2026 and will inform the priorities for the recommissioning of the All-Age Carers Service.
